## YOU'RE AN AUDIOLOGIST AND AN OFFICER

The audiologist is primarily responsible for helping Soldiers preserve an important communication tool: the ability to hear. Audiologists work with the most advanced technology and develop new skills that can enhance your career.

In addition to a health care provider, you will be a commissioned officer, gaining the respect, responsibility and prestige that are afforded your rank. Your Army Reserve experience will begin with the Basic Officer Leadership Course at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, Texas. In this two-week orientation, you and your colleagues will learn about the Army way of life and experience the physical and mental challenges you'll face as an officer and a leader while serving with the Army Reserve Health Care Team.

### **REQUIREMENTS**

- Requires a doctoral degree from an accredited program in audiology from a school acceptable to the OTSG.
  Candidates with a clinical doctoral degree (Au.D.) must have completed an accredited 1 year clinical audiology externship or be enrolled in the Army Audiology Externship Program (AEP).
- Permanent U.S. residency is required for Reserve duty officers.
- Must be between 21 and 42 years of age (may request a waiver, locate A Recruiter for more information.)
- Must be a U.S. citizen

### **TRAINING**

Job training for an audiologist includes completing an Basic Officer Leaders Course, which introduces you to the Army Health Care system, Army doctrine and basic Soldier/leader skills.
